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## Introduction & overview of requirements (self-study)

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### Introduction:

The course is designed to address the needs of a busy executive that has limited time to get to know the requirements of ISO 9001:2015. The interpretation of every clause of the standard targets those who have very limited or no understanding of ISO 9001.

The clauses of the standard are explained using the context of a business environment but may be applied to any organisation irrespective of type or size.

### Course outcomes:

- Understand the intent of each clause of the standard.
- Be in a position to make strategic decisions regarding management support and implementation.

### Who should attend:

- Top management
- Anyone in a management or supervisory role that manages business processes subject to requirements of the standard.

### Benefits:

- Receive interpretations from a Registered Lead Auditor that participates in ISO/TC176.

Knowledge of the requirements of the ISO 9001:2015 standard is delivered through a series of pre-recorded audio-visual presentations that interpret the requirements of the standard. This information is further supplemented by written notes and templates.

The audio-visual presentations are delivered in segments of about 20 minutes or shorter. The full run time is less than 2 hours. A series of multiple choice questions supplement the learning provided by each module. The course must be completed within a three-month period from registration.

Although not entirely essential, for best benefit, candidates are encouraged to use an original copy of the standard in order to review its content in conjunction with this presentation.
